Hi Tom, as you requested I reviewed the Golden Racquets finances from last year. Since I am not a CPA, I won't call this an audit but would rather just a review. After looking at the finances and talking with Al, I was very impressed with the methodology and the thoroughness of the procedures. There seem to be very adequate cross checks to make sure that everything balances. The numbers themselves, well I didn't look in great detail, also look very reasonable. My only suggestion is that I did not find in the materials or on the website a couple of basic financial statements, i.e. the balance sheet and the income statement. While these are implicit in the tax return, I think it would be useful to have them developed explicitly and also to post them on the web site. The tax return also looked fine to me and I would suggest that that be posted on the website also, as I believe the IRS requires it to be made publicly available. Let me know if there is anything else that I can do.
